


NIPT: why no-call rates matter.

In clinical contexts, a noninvasive prenatal test (NIPT) with a low no-call rate delivers more results to women, reducing their chances of anxiety, financial stress¹, or potential pregnancy complications.²

Example A hypothetical NIPT screening is conducted on 1,000 pregnancies to detect a condition with 1.3% prevalence. Which test would you choose? 1.000 pregnancies 13 affected
